Materials List

Most of the materials below can be found at Art Things in West Annapolis, but you can also order them online at Dick Blick, or Art Supply Warehouse.

Palette knives – #44 Blue handle palette knife from DickBlick.com. are probably your best option. Art Things has Holbein knives, that are excellent, but pricey. They also have RCM knives that are o.k., but inexpensive.

Gessoed masonite hardboard - 16x20, 14x18 or 12x16. Pre-gessoed boards are available at Art Things in West Annapolis. If you want to make your own boards, Home Depot will cut a 4'x8' sheet of 3/16th inch Eucatex hardboard up for you. *Show them the diagram on page 2 as a guide.* You will then need to gesso the boards using Liquitex Gesso. Brush lightly left to right, top to bottom, across the board as the gesso dries to eliminate ridges. I will give a demo of how to gesso boards at the first class.

Large wood or acrylic palette. If using a wood palette, make sure it is polyurethane coated or otherwise sealed. My favorite is Turtlewood palettes: <http://www.turtlewoodpalettes.com/> You can also order one online from Dick Blick for \$16.97 - <http://www.dickblick.com/items/03087-1117/> Or get a 18x24 sheet of plexiglass from Tru Value Hardware (But when we paint outside you have to bring something to set it on.)

Cap or hat with a brim

Grumbacher or Winsor Newton extra-soft vine charcoal

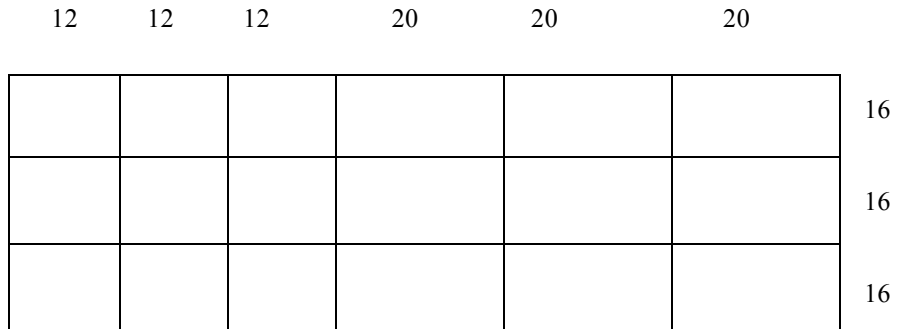
Oil Paint (Winsor & Newton, Gamblin, or Graham) :

Titanium White (large tube)
Viridian
Cadmium lemon
Cadmium yellow
Cadmium orange
Cadmium red
Scarlet Lake (Winsor Newton) or Cadmium scarlet
Permanent rose
Ultramarine blue
Cerulean blue
Permanent green light
